


Daily Schedule

Enrollment & Fees

The camp is open to children who have **completed grades K-8**. Go to www.ilcsp.org to register online or download the registration form.

Enrollment and space in electives are limited, so register early! A registration fee of **\$50 per person** will be required to hold your spot and will be applied to your total tuition fee. The registration fee is non-refundable.

Please send one registration form per child and one registration check per family.

Registration deadline, including fee, is July 31. No exceptions can be made.

Core Curriculum

Daily Devo

When we put on "New Glasses," things look different. We see the unexpected! In Daily Devo, campers will "wear" different glasses that allow us to see people and situations as God does. Each day we'll explore stories of how Jesus lived and cared for others. Using our creativity and imaginations, we'll look for ways to model the just, peaceful and loving world he called for.

Art for All

Each camper will make a lidded keepsake box. We'll use cardboard construction and papier-mâché techniques to construct and colorize the box. Use your own "vision" to decorate the boxes with beads, baubles and more. This will be a personal art piece to treasure!

Choir Time

Singing is good for your body, mind and spirit! In choir, campers will learn fundamental choral and music skills in a fun-filled way. Music that is age appropriate will reflect the theme of this year's camp. We will pick up new glasses and learn exciting music from around the world, teaming up with other electives and showcasing our music on Friday evening.

Class Groupings

Primary: Completed K & Grade 1

Lower: Completed Grades 2 & 3

Middle: Completed Grades 4 & 5

Upper: Completed Grades 6, 7 & 8

Elective Course Descriptions

Campers in Lower, Middle and Upper Grades customize their camp experience by selecting the electives they would like.* Each camper in these grades needs to select one elective from each of the three pairings below.

Primary Grades will have shortened class times and participate in four of the electives, as selected by camp organizers.

*IMAC reserves the right to change the breakdown of camper groupings as necessary based on registration to ensure an appropriate camper/teacher ratio.

Choice 1

Yoga

In this elective, young yogis will experience poses, stretches, breath work, games and relaxation. We will play and explore in a non-competitive environment. We'll work on strength, balance, self-confidence, respect for self and others, as well as finding joy and vitality in our bodies.

— OR —

African Drumming

Join a dynamic session of African drumming, singing and movement. Find unity in playing rhythms together that transcend culture and place, led by an expert in West African drumming and culture. Discipline and respect come naturally as we make music together.

Choice 2

Group Uke

This elective provides the tools to start playing songs on the ukulele right away. We'll learn fun tunes by great musicians and lay down grooves and melodies as an all-ukulele band! Bring your own uke or use one of ours.

— OR —

Clay Creativity

Explore clay techniques and create a unique sculpture in this elective. We'll sculpt, paint and glaze our creations and display them in the Friday showcase. This a great time to get a little messy and experience the natural calm you get from handling clay.

Choice 3

Creative Writing

If you have a great imagination, here's your chance to create something awesome! Through individual and group writing activities tailored to each age group, we'll play with words and find out just how powerful language can be. We'll write poems and tell stories, using our talents to explore new perspectives.

Handbells

Playing handbells is fun! Campers will grow musically as we experience ringing in an ensemble. Throughout the week we will learn bell techniques and musical concepts while making beautiful music! IMAC recommends that campers can read music to get the most from this elective.
