Scholarship News from Bega Kwa Bega and our Mkimbizi sister congregation in Iringa, Tanzania

Immanuel members annually sponsor twenty-four secondary school (high school) students from Mkimbizi. We also contribute \$1000 to the post-secondary (college) scholarship program. Thank you!

On August 29th and 30th a small team of leaders from St. Paul and Iringa interviewed 53 applicants for scholarships for post-secondary education. The Bega Kwa Bega scholarship program has been in place long enough that now many students are completing secondary school and going on to the university or specialized training for careers such as teaching or nursing.

Most of the students who applied had managed to pay for their first year of school (in some cases two years of school) but are out of options for how to fund their education going forward. Several students had worked before starting school to earn enough money initially, but now cannot work enough while in school to pay the entirety of their school fees. Some students borrowed money from family and friends and, although unsure how to pay it back, are determined that they will. Some told us their families had borrowed money for their education but could not borrow any more. Many students told stories of being without one or both parents due to disability, death, or abandonment.

The team spoke to students who are studying to be teachers, pharmacists, journalists, engineers, nurses, community development workers, livestock managers, laboratory technicians, medical officers, surveyors, accountants, and doctors. Every student was asked how he or she thinks they will contribute to the church when they complete their education. Here is some of what we heard:

- "I want to teach others to be leaders."
- "I have a spirit of caring."
- "As a pharmacist I can treat people with medicine but also with prayer."
- "I want to stand for the rights of Tanzanian people who cannot get what they need."
- "I want to provide knowledge to the community. I can help to prevent disease by building good toilets."
- "I want to help people with their health."
- "Education is everything. I want others to know that without education, there is nothing."
- "I was funded by Bega Kwa Bega [scholarship] since Form I. I want to pay back for all that I received."

All of these students passed either Form IV or Form VI in secondary school in order to be accepted into a diploma or bachelor's degree program. Even with many big obstacles in their way, including a limited number of spots available in secondary schools, they have even bigger dreams.

While aggressive efforts were underway to rid Christian’s body of Cancer, Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia, a tremendous amount of assistance was offered to our family. The phrase, “it takes a village”, took on new meaning as we discovered how so many good people were instrumental in buoying up Christian’s spirits for 3 ½ years, while relieving our ongoing stress. Prayers were continuous, fund-raising very helpful (Thanks, Kim Thompson!), meals delivered, play dates provided for Anders, and many seemingly small things cumulatively supported all four of us and made Christian’s precariously balanced life, wonderful. And this prayer, despite unimaginable pain and horrors I won’t describe, was a surprise to hear, and something we’ve contemplated for years.

9 Council Update

October 16th, 2018 Council Meeting Summary

Joe Dufresne opened the meeting. Pastor Cindy led the devotion, encouraging us to “let your God love you.”

The following is a summary of the council meeting:

- The council approved a Paulsen Bequest fund request for \$2000 for a program to purchase clothing for Safe House.
- The council discussed raising the dollar amount that the Paulsen Bequest committee can release without Council approval to \$2000 (the current limit is \$500.) The committee will send the policy and guidelines used to review grant requests to the council for review. The council will consider the request at the November meeting.
- The Capital Campaign 6 committee requested \$10,000 to hire a consultant, Brenda Moore, to coach them through the campaign. The Council approved the request.
- Jeff Engelking and Mark Thompson presented the quarterly finance report. Year-to-date offering and expenses are tracking closely to plan. Budgeting for 2019 is underway and will be discussed in more detail at the November and December meetings.
- The council discussed the proposed governance changes and feedback received thus far. The Exec Plus committee is meeting with church groups to discuss the proposal and answer questions.

The Official minutes of each Council meeting can be obtained at the church office. If you have any questions or comments please contact Joe Dufresne, Congregation President (joe@dufresne.us, 612.840.6498), or any Council member. The Council meets at 7:00pm in the Gathering Space on the third Tuesday of every month, except in July. Meetings are open to the public and all are welcome to attend.
